Paisley Arts Centre reopened in Summer 2024 after a £3m transformation.

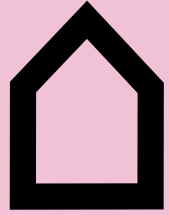

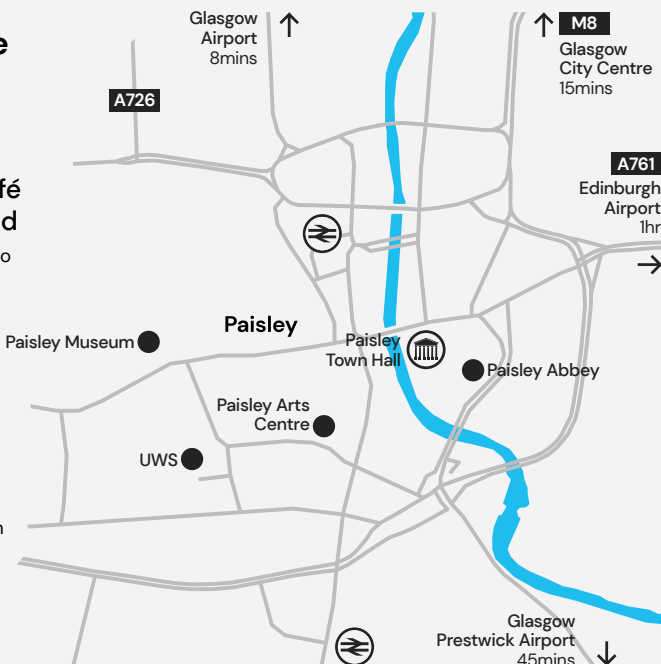
